Pedicled Fasciocutaneous Anterolateral Thigh Flap for the Reconstruction of a Postoncologic Abdominal Wall Resection Defect—Case Report

Abstract:

The anterolateral thigh (ALT) flap has been used to cover defects between the proximal third of the leg and lower abdomen, and with modification, may cover epigastric defects. A 79-year-old male patient presented a fibrosarcoma in LLQ abdomen about 10 X 8 cm. We used the ALT flap to cover a full-thickness defect of over half the anterior abdominal wall. We conclude that abdominal defects of postoncologic surgery can be reconstructed using a pedicled ALT flap, a simple, effective, single-stage procedure to attempt the primary goals of abdominal wall reconstruction.
